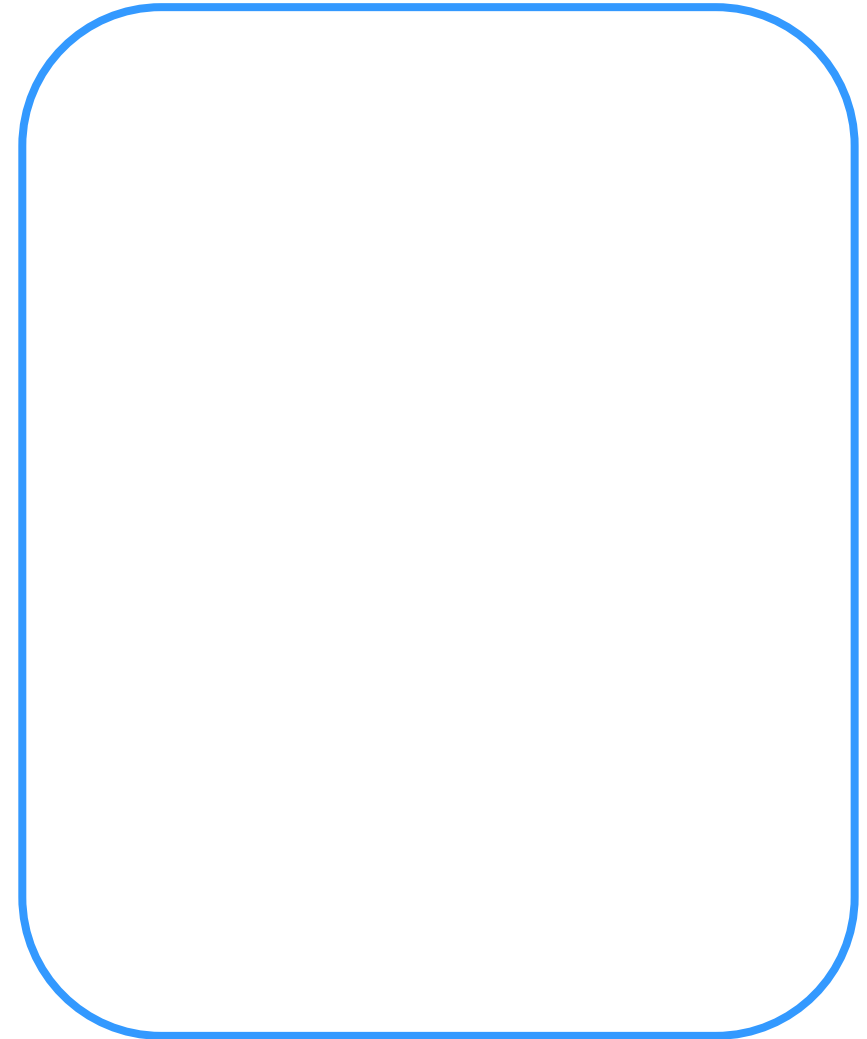

Make a pencil rubbing by placing this paper over a man-made object such as a coin or bricks and gently rub the blunt side of a pencil over it to create a drawing.

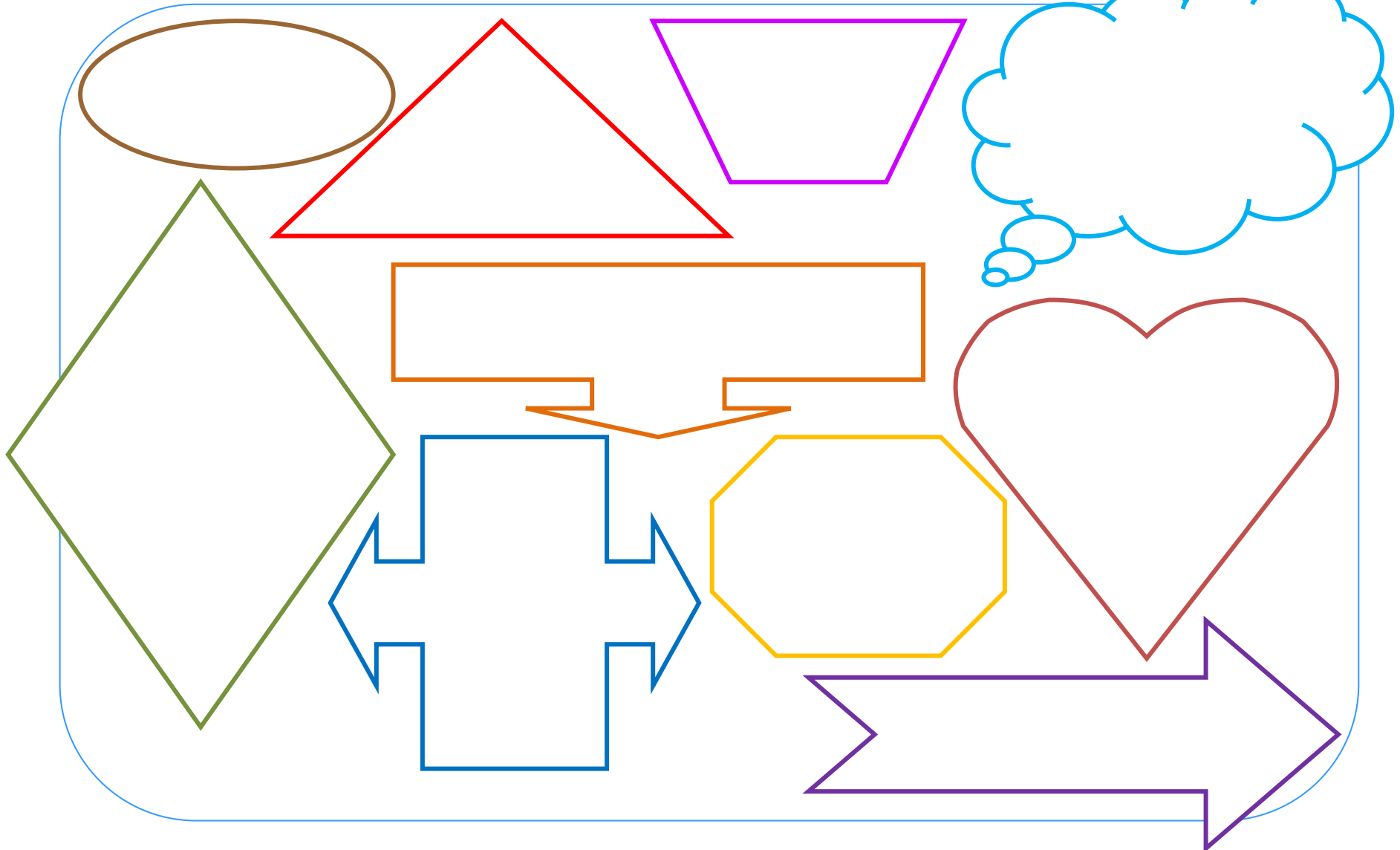


something natural...

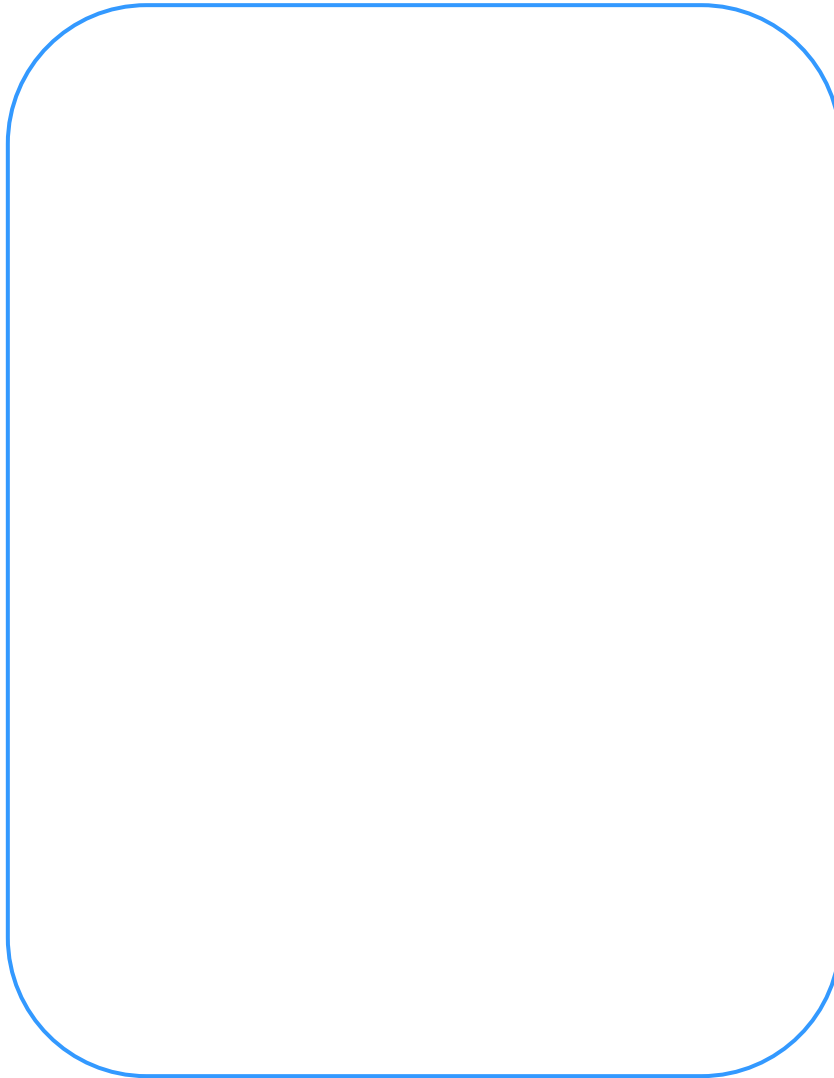
Make a pencil rubbing by placing this paper over a natural object such as a leaf or tree bark and gently rub the blunt side of a pencil over it to create a drawing.

Find a sculpture that looks interesting to you and write some describing words in the shapes below.

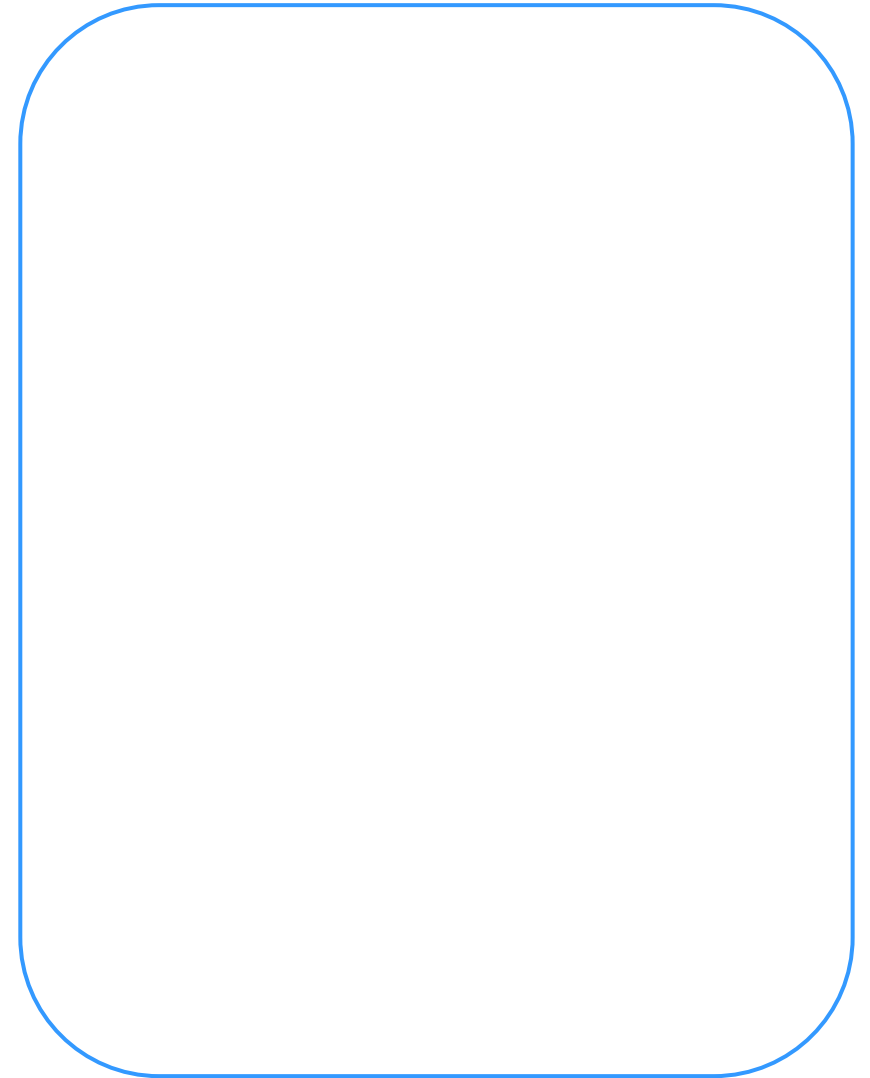

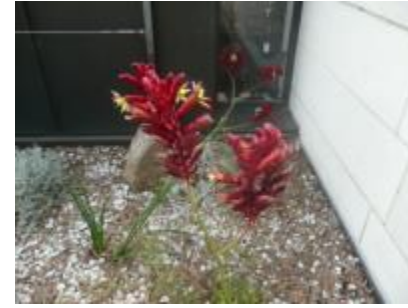

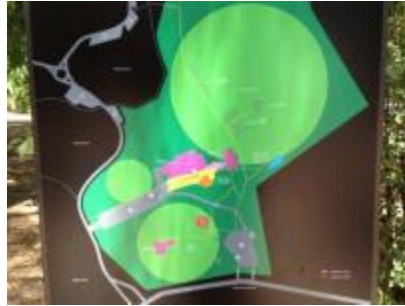
